David J. Beare

Head of School

A veteran teacher, coach, and administrator, David comes to Middlesex with 30 years of boarding and day school experience on the East Coast, West Coast, and abroad. A passionate and devoted teacher of history, philosophy, and religious studies, he has served on the faculty at the Loomis Chaffee School, Phillips Exeter Academy, Lakeside School, and The Hotchkiss School, where he co-chaired the Humanities and Social Sciences Department. In 2013, David became the dean of faculty at the newly founded Keystone Academy in Beijing, where his wife Rachael – also a career educator – had begun her work as dean of admission the year before. There, he continued to teach and manage dorm duties, was named associate head of school, and served as acting head of school for nearly a year. A graduate of Georgetown University, David holds an Ed.M. from Harvard's Graduate School of Education and an M.Div. from Harvard's Divinity School.
