To All Middlesex Parents and Students:

Please review together the overnight, driving, travel to Boston and swimming and boating permissions contained on this form and determine which categories should govern the student during the coming academic year. Second, we ask that you spend time together reading and discussing the Middlesex rules contained in the *Handbook*. We believe these convey valuable information on Middlesex students' behavior and state and federal laws. It is important that both parents and students fully understand these expectations and rules.

## **OVERNIGHT RESTRICTIONS**

Students who wish to spend a night away from Middlesex not in the presence of their parents must follow one of the following procedures. In all such cases, students must receive an invitation from an adult host, provide the Head of House with both a destination and a telephone number where the student can be reached in case of emergency, and follow the appropriate sign-out procedures. The School reserves the right to review specific weekend plans with parents at its discretion. A student may not change plans after leaving campus unless the student has first been in the presence of their parents or has contacted their Head of House and verified that this change of plan is acceptable.

	Our child must talk with us about plans and destination before each overnight so that we may give our approval. It is our responsibility to notify the Head of House in each case that our approval has been granted.
	Our child only needs an invitation from an adult host of our approximate age who will assume responsibility for our child. The Head of House must verify this invitation. It is not necessary that our child notify us and receive our approval each time.

Heads of Houses will not give boarding students to spend a night away from campus without adult supervision unless specific verbal or written authorization from ardians has been received by the Deans' Office.
