To All Middlesex Day Parents and Students:

Please review together the driving, swimming and boating permissions contained on this form and determine which categories should govern the student during the coming academic year. Second, we ask that you spend time together reading and discussing the Middlesex rules contained in the *Handbook*. We believe these convey valuable information on rules for Middlesex students' behavior, and certain state and federal laws. We have done our best to be specific about our rules and expectations. However, we recognize that we can't anticipate every eventuality, and we ask students and parents to observe the spirit as well as the letter of the rules.

DRIVING PERMISSION (FOR GRADES 11 AND 12 ONLY)

9th and 10th grade students are not permitted to drive with day students except in a car pool situation or for a School related event. The School is concerned about appropriate, safe automobile use. Students occasionally need or wish to travel in cars with drivers other than a Middlesex faculty member or a member of their immediate family. Please note that day students leaving campus for any reason besides returning home for the evening must obtain permission from a faculty member. While we restrict day student driving to commuting and travel to nearby communities, once a student driver leaves campus, with or without passengers, the School is not in the position to exercise any meaningful supervision.

Our child may drive with any licensed driver OVER twenty one years of age.

TRAVEL TO REGIONAL CITIES (BOSTON/CAMBRIDGE)

Middlesex students, being located in the town of Concord, have access to public transportation that travels to the region’s many historical and beautiful cities and towns. On occasional Sundays, Middlesex provides transportation to Alewife station where students can ride the subway to Boston or Cambridge. Following School procedure and guidelines in the Handbook, all students can travel to Boston, Cambridge or other cities and towns without adult supervision.

SWIMMING AND BOATING RESTRICTIONS

Middlesex students have ready access to several bodies of water, both on and off campus. Under no circumstance may a student swim after dark or alone.

Our child is a competent swimmer and has our permission to swim in the School pond or on School-sponsored trips during daylight hours. We recognize that such swimming will be unsupervised and that the School assumes no responsibility for such activity.
